Proverbs

The following questions are for group discussion. The discussion should aim to help participants think through the lesson and its application both personally and in the church.

- 1. What is a proverb? What are some practical advantages to them? Does the Book of Proverbs contain only proverbs? Who does the book target? How can we use it today?
- 2. What are some helpful principles to remember when reading, interpreting, and seeking to apply the Proverbs? Are proverbs promises? What is parallelism?
- 3. In your own words, what is the purpose of the Book of Proverbs? Is God worthy of all trust in every dimension of everyday life?
- 4. To what is wisdom linked? To what is folly linked? See 2:6-15; 4:13-14, 18, 20-27; 5:1-6, 23; 9:13; 10:17; 12:28.
- 5. What is the beginning of wisdom (1:7, 29; 2:5; 3:7; 8:13; 9:10; 10:27; 14:2, 26, 27; 15:16, 33; 16:6; 19:23; 22:4; 23:17; 24:21; 28:14; 29:25; 31:30)?
- 6. What is the reward of diligently seeking Wisdom (2:4-5; 8:17)?
- 7. What is the value of Wisdom (3:13-18; 8:11, 19)?
- 8. Is the Book of Proverbs closer to the Law or Gospel? Explain.
- 9. How could Proverbs help you daily? Consider the categories (a) 10:11; 12:14; 13:2-3; 15:4; 16:24; 18:21 (b) 12:15; 13:1; 15:31, 32; 18:13, 15, 17; 19:20 (c) 14:17, 29; 15:1, 18
- 10. Does **discernment** also need **discipline**? Why? Does it also need **devotion**? Why?
